## Quality assurance: Object and objectives

- The object of quality assurance is the core product of a university:
  - the responsible
  - warranty
  - on a successful study process
  - for all enrolled students

## Quality assurance: Who has to do what?

- quality aspects have to be defined – this is the task of the departments / faculties of a university who define the desired contents of a study programme
- quality assurance is an empirical process – empirical data about the courses offered and the the progress of individual students have to be collected and analysed

## Quality relevant data

- subjective evaluation of courses by students
- data about the progress of individual students
- distribution of students per study programme and semester, of marks given in each module, of general marks at the final examination, numbers of students in each course, drop-out rates

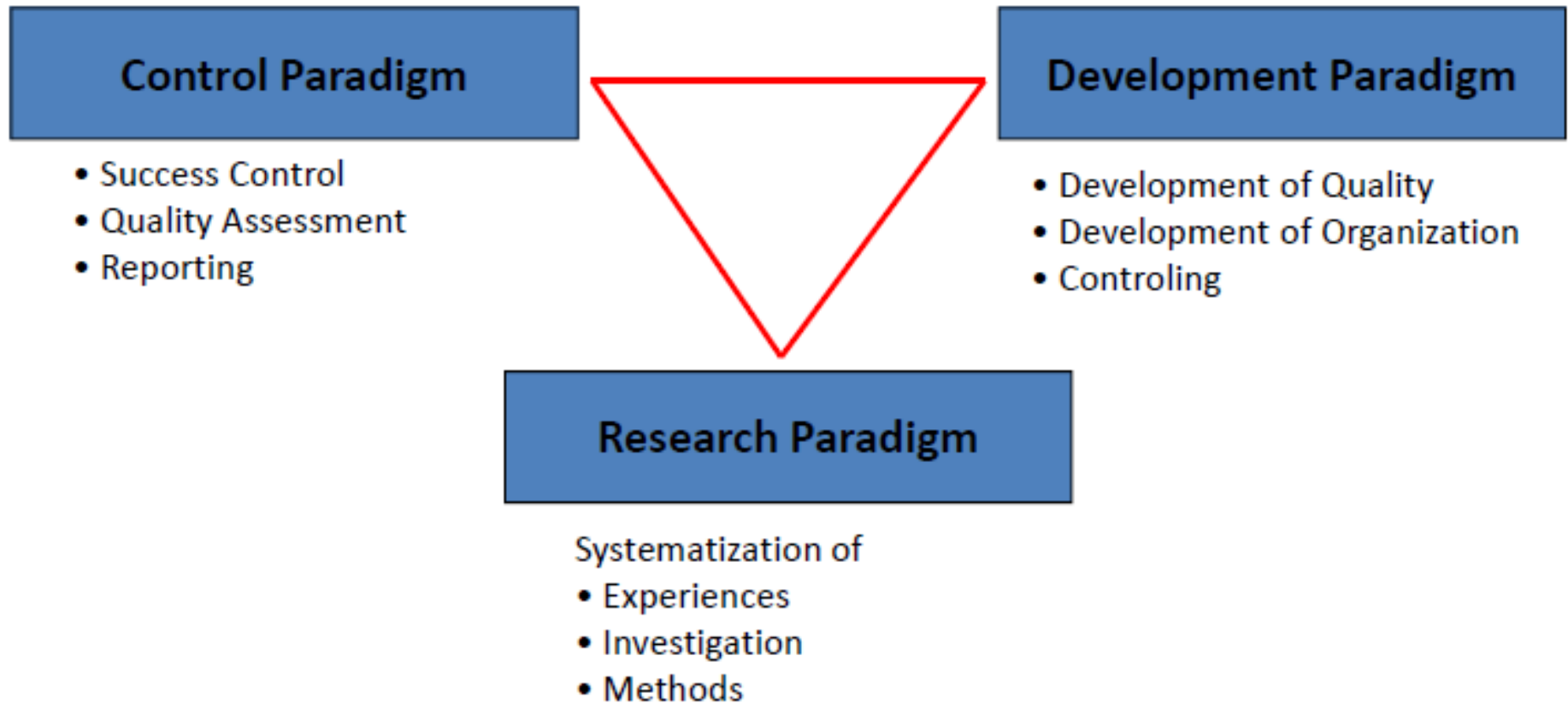
## What to do with the data

- discuss the student evaluation results among faculty members
- offering help to faculty members with negative evaluation results
- finding out which students need mentoring

## Indicators and instruments

- **warranty: workload questionnaire (standardised)**
- **responsiveness:**
  - achievement questionnaire (standardised)
  - narrative interviews and focus groups (non-standardised)
  - discussion among the faculty members of a study programme
- **study process: statistical data of the examination office**
- **students: entrance questionnaire**

# German System of Accreditation in HE



## Accreditation

**Accreditation** follows the control paradigm of evaluation.

**Accreditation** assesses **minimal standards** of institutions or study programs. The goals are prescribed from **outside**.



## Accreditation Council

The **accreditation** of study programs in Germany is coordinated by the

**“Foundation for the Accreditation of Study Programmes in Germany”**,  
(short “Accreditation Council” )

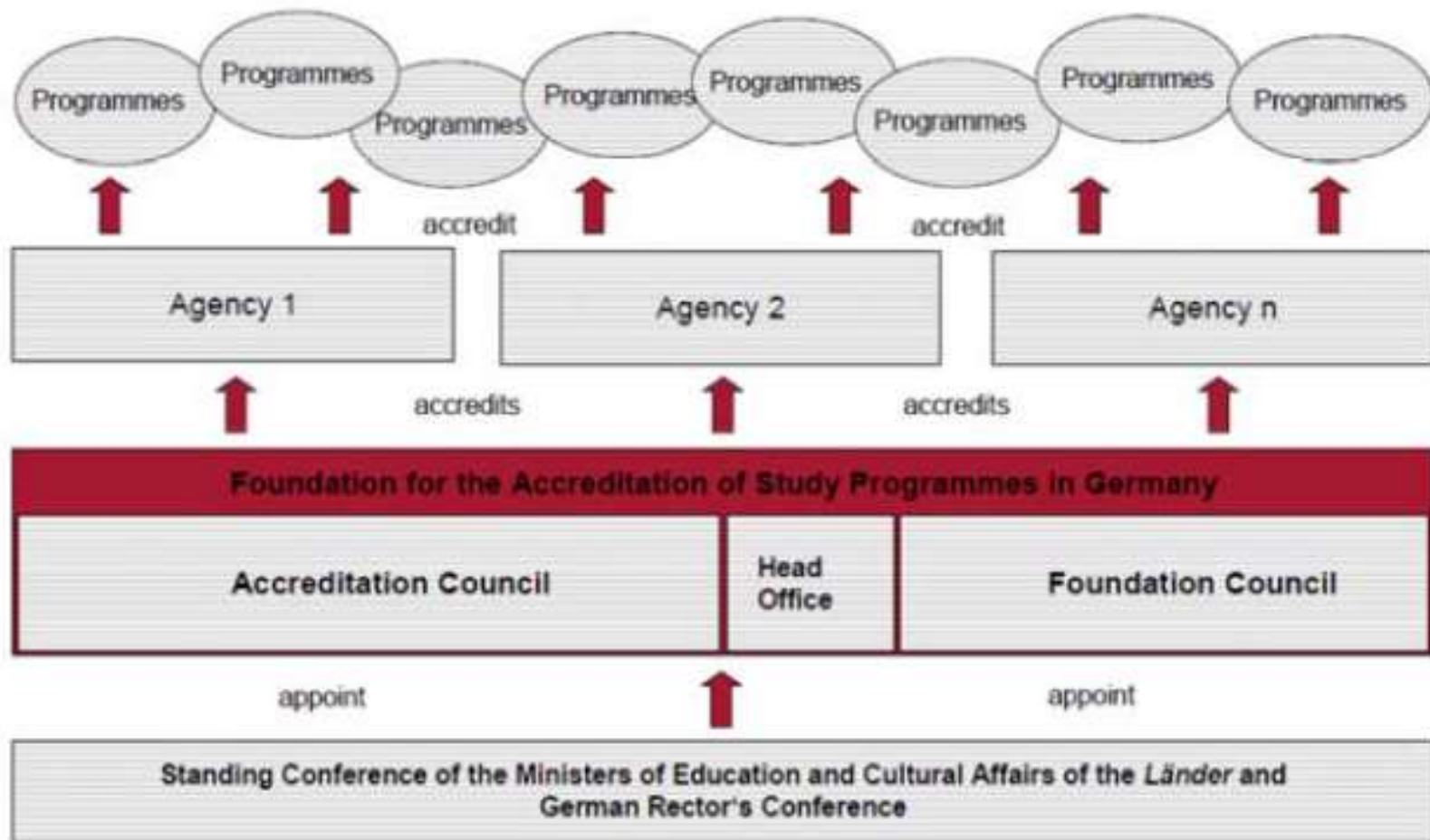
The foundation is **under public law** and was established in **2005**.

## Accreditation Council

The council **certifies** „**agencies**“ to carry out the processes of accreditation of study programmes at higher educational institutes.

The **agencies** are given the authority to award the **Quality Seal** of the council.

The council is **constituted** from members of different ‚stakeholders‘:

- **Higher Education Institutions**
- **German States**
- professional **practitioners**
- **foreign** experts
- **students**
- **accreditation agencies**

## Accreditation

The objects of the **Accreditation Process** are study programmes for Bachelor and Master Degrees from state, or state recognised, Higher Education Institutions in Germany.

Where any study programmes are combined in a logical and justified way, the accreditation can also be carried as a combined package (**Cluster**).

## ASIIN

**ASIIN** (Accreditation Agency for Degree Programmes in Engineering, Informatics/Computer Science, the Natural Sciences and Mathematics ) is a German **accreditation agency** for

- engineering (Ingenieurwissenschaften)
- computer science (Informatik)
- natural sciences (Naturwissenschaften)
- mathematics
- all interdisciplinary areas including one of these subject areas
- teacher training programmes

## Programme vs. System Accreditation

ASIIN performs

- (single) **programme accreditation** for single study programs
- **cluster programme accreditation** for groups of study programs
- **system accreditation** for institutions

# Outline of the procedure

## 1. Preparation and application

- **University** submits request to ASIIN, including the accreditation request and a short curricular overview.
- **ASIIN** accepts the reviews the preliminary information with regard to the responsibilities, possible clustering, and the number of peers required. ASIIN generates an offer for the accreditation procedure containing a request for confirmation of costs.

# Outline of the procedure

## 2. Review

- **University** generates a self assessment report in accordance with the suggested structure. (**ASIIN** offers a preliminary meeting to review the report wrt. formal completeness.)
- ASIIN selects **an Audit Team**.
- The Audit Team conducts an **on-site visit** at the university (one and a half days).
- **ASIIN** submits the accreditation report to the university for review of technical errors and statement.
- **University** issues a statement and makes possible corrections and changes to the accreditation report.

## Outline of the procedure

### 3. Decision and completion

- **ASIIN** passes final evaluation report on with recommendations.
- Relevant **Technical Committee** comments on it.
- The **ASIIN Accreditation Commission** for Degree Programmes decides on it.
- **ASIIN** communicates the decision to the applying university and the German Accreditation Council.
- ASIIN publishes a of a summary on the internet according to the provisions of the Accreditation Council.

## Outcome of the procedure

The responsible **Accreditation Commission** from the Agency decides

- either to **grant** an accreditation for the relevant study programme,
- to **grant** an accreditation **with conditions**,
- to **abandon** the process,
- or to **reject** the accreditation.

The accreditation is awarded for a **limited period** and carries the Quality Seal of the Foundation for the duration of this period.

## Seal

In the course of an ASIIN programme accreditation procedure the **ASIIN seal** is acquired for each degree programme accredited by the ASIIN Accreditation Commission.



In the area covered by the German Accreditation Council, ASIIN additionally awards the **seal of the Council**.

## Complaints

An HEI directly may lodge a **complaint** (objection) against the decision of the Accreditation Commission.

- within a month after receipt of the decision
- based on the fact that the decision of the Accreditation Commission violates the “General Criteria”

The complaint will be discussed by the agency’s separate **Board of Complaints**.
